

Home is the Key Family Fundraising Calendar

Thank you for involving your family in the Mission of Habitat for Humanity of Burlington, Mercer, and Atlantic Counties: Our mission is to work in partnership with community partners and families in-need to build decent affordable homes and strong communities.

Our "Home is the Key" Fundraising Calendar is designed to involve the entire family in contemplating the people and things that make a home, as well as exploring what those living in dilapidated, overcrowded, or insecure housing may experience just to get through every day.

Parents and adult family members: You will guide the discussion. The calendar contains facts about Habitat for Humanity, New Jersey's housing crisis, and the difference a safe and affordable home can make.

- Toddlers- If you have very young children, they can color or paint the house bank that comes with the calendar. They can practice fine motor skills by putting coins in the bank slot.
- Elementary aged children can do some of the counting called for in the bank deposit instructions. Perhaps they can perform some of the math functions to figure out what a deposit should be.
- Older children can assist with the advanced math. They could also play around with some of the statistics we quote on the calendar. One example is that a person working a 40-hour work week in New Jersey would need to make \$29 per hour to afford the median rent on a two-bedroom apartment. If they can follow that through to get the median rent, they could then figure out how many hours a person making \$12.00, New Jersey's minimum wage, would have to work to afford the same apartment.
- All children can help younger siblings. Older kids can practice counting with toddlers and help elementary aged siblings with math.

The important thing is that this is something the family does together. All the physical characteristics mentioned on the calendar make a house, but family makes a home. Have fun and thank you again from everyone at Habitat for Humanity of Burlington, Mercer, and Atlantic Counties!
